$$\frac{x(t)}{v} r$$

$$\frac{dx}{dt} = cr - \frac{x(t)}{v} r$$

$$\frac{dx}{dt} + \frac{r}{v} x(t) = cr$$

$$2. \quad \frac{dx}{dt} + 2x(t) = 2c, \quad x(0) = 0$$

$$\frac{dx}{dt} = 2(c - x(t))$$

$$0 = c - k$$

$$c = k$$

$$\int \frac{1}{c - x(t)} dx = \int 2 dt$$

$$-\ln |c - x(t)| = 2t + k_1$$

$$|c - x(t)| = e^{-2t - k_1}$$

$$x(t) = (-k)e^{-2t}$$

$$\therefore x(t) = c(1 - e^{-2t})$$

Limiting amount is the concentration C, yes.

$$1 - e^{-2t} = 0.5$$

$$e^{-2t} = 0.5$$


$$-2t = \ln 0.5$$

$$R \frac{dI}{dt} + \frac{1}{C} I = \frac{dV}{dt}$$

$$V(t) = V_0$$

$$\Rightarrow R \frac{dI}{dt} + \frac{1}{C} I = 0$$

$$\frac{dI}{dt} = -\frac{1}{RC} I$$

$$\int \frac{1}{I} dI = -\int \frac{1}{RC} dt$$

$$\ln |I| = -\frac{t}{RC} + k_1$$

$$I = \pm K e^{-\frac{t}{RC}} \quad I = R C$$

$$\therefore I = I(0) e^{-\frac{t}{RC}}$$

$$I(t+T) = I(0) e^{-\frac{t+T}{T}}$$

$$= I(0) e^{-\frac{T}{T}} \cdot e^{-1}$$

$$= \frac{I(0)}{e}$$
