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$$a. z = -2 + 3i$$

$$r = \sqrt{(-2)^2 + 3^2}$$

$$= \sqrt{13}$$

$$z = \sqrt{13} e^{i \tan^{-1} \frac{3}{-2}}$$

$$d. \frac{1}{-2+3i}$$

$$= \frac{-2-3i}{4-9i^2}$$

$$= -\frac{2}{13} - \frac{3}{13}i$$

$$b. 3e^{i\frac{\pi}{6}} = 3 \left( \cos \frac{\pi}{6} + i \sin \frac{\pi}{6} \right)$$

$$= 3 \left( \frac{\sqrt{3}}{2} + i \frac{1}{2} \right)$$

$$= \frac{3\sqrt{3}}{2} + \frac{3}{2}i$$

$$r = \sqrt{\left(\frac{-2}{\sqrt{13}}\right)^2 + \left(\frac{3}{\sqrt{13}}\right)^2}$$

$$= \sqrt{\frac{4+9}{169}}$$

$$= \frac{\sqrt{13}}{13}$$

$$\theta = \tan^{-1} \frac{-\frac{3}{\sqrt{13}}}{-\frac{2}{\sqrt{13}}}$$

c.

$$z = \frac{\sqrt{13}}{13} e^{i \tan^{-1} \frac{-3}{-2}} = \tan^{-1} \frac{-3}{-2}$$

$$e. \sqrt[3]{1}$$

$$z^3 = 1$$

$$r^3 e^{i\theta} = 1 \cdot e^{\frac{2k\pi i}{3}}, \quad k=0, \pm 1, \pm 2, \dots$$

$$\begin{aligned} r^3 &= 1 & n\theta &= 2k\pi \\ r &= 1 & \theta &= \frac{2k\pi}{n}, \quad k=0, 1, \dots, n-1 \end{aligned}$$

$$\theta' = \theta + 2a\pi, \quad a \in \mathbb{Z}$$

$$\begin{aligned} e^{i\theta'} &= e^{i(\theta+2a\pi)} \\ &= e^{i\theta} \cdot e^{i2a\pi} \\ &= e^{i\theta} \cdot (e^{i\pi})^a \\ &= e^{i\theta} \end{aligned}$$

$$e^{\frac{2k\pi i}{3}}, \quad k=0, 1, 2$$

$$z = e^0, e^{\frac{2\pi i}{3}}, e^{\frac{4\pi i}{3}}$$

$$= 1, \cos \frac{2\pi}{3} + i \sin \frac{2\pi}{3}, \cos \frac{4\pi}{3} + i \sin \frac{4\pi}{3}$$

$$= 1, -\frac{1}{2} + \frac{\sqrt{3}}{2}i, -\frac{1}{2} - \frac{\sqrt{3}}{2}i$$
